HISTORY

The Alâwiyya International Sufi Association (AISA International NGO) was established on 11 October 2001. It draws its values from the universal wisdom of the Alâwî Sufi order – an organization recognized by UNESCO in 2013 (191 EX/32 INF) as a school for tolerance and inter-religious fellowship that promotes Living Together in Peace. It ensures the conservation and transmission of a spiritual and humanistic heritage.

In 2012, AISA was recognized by the United Nations as an international non-governmental organization, empowered to contribute to the universal goals of peace and social progress pursued by the UN. On 19 January 2014, it acquired special consultative status with the Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) of the United Nations (Report E/2014/32 Part I). The organization works in areas of expertise as varied as the culture of peace, gender equality, social development, environment, global governance, ethics, and spirituality. In December 2021, AISA International NGO created a humanitarian department through which it implemented programs in Algeria and Benin to help victims of the COVID19- pandemic.

The International Day of Living Together in Peace

AISA International NGO is the founder of the International Day of Living Together in Peace (IDLTP), adopted unanimously by the 193 Member States of the United Nations on 8 December 2017, resolution (<u>A/RES/72/130</u>). It is celebrated on 16 May each year. Among other declarations, the resolution:

Underlines that the International Day of Living Together in Peace constitutes a means of regularly mobilizing the efforts of the international community to promote peace, tolerance, inclusion, understanding and solidarity, and to express its attachment to the desire to live and act together, united in differences and diversity, in order to build a sustainable world of peace, solidarity and harmony;

The challenge is to develop a responsible and united global citizenship




Invites all Member States, organizations of the United Nations system and other international and regional organizations, as well as civil society, including nongovernmental organizations and individuals, to observe the International Day of Living Together in Peace in accordance with the culture and other appropriate circumstances or customs of their local, national and regional communities, including through education and public awareness-raising activities;

Invites all Member States to further promote reconciliation to help to ensure peace and sustainable development, including by working with communities, faith leaders and other relevant actors, through reconciliatory measures and acts of service and by encouraging forgiveness and compassion among individuals;


GOVERNANCE

Members of AISA International NGO elect delegates to form the General Assembly.




GENERAL ASSEMBLY
